You will need:

- Clean cloth
- Paintbrush
- Resene Aquaclear gloss
- Resene Quick Dry
- Resene testpots of Resene **Optimist and Resene Yeehaa**
- Resene testpot roller and tray
- Sandpaper

- Screwdriver
- Skateboard



Step one Unscrew the wheels from the skateboard.



Carefully remove any plastic transfers covering.



Step three Sand the wood to remove any residue and wipe off any sanding dust with a clean cloth.



Step four Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the skateboard and allow two hours to dry.



Step five Apply one coat of Resene Optimist to the skateboard and allow two hours to dry.



Step six Apply two coats of Resene Yeehaa to the skateboard, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



Step seven Apply three coats of Resene Aquaclear gloss the skateboard, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



Step eight Carefully reattach the wheels, taking care not to damage the paint.

Transform a humble skateboard into a metallic masterpiece with a little bit of help from Resene.



To get the look: Mark painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Low **Sheen tinted to Resene** Silver Chalice.



Paint red stripes on the skateboard using **Resene Rocket and low** tack masking tape.
