## Website **Time Savers**

Over the last couple of years, we have been quietly adding lots of extra features to the **Resene website www.resene.co.nz**, many of which have been requested by various painters, specifiers and customers who have contacted our Marketing Department. What started as 10 pages of company information is now over 1000 pages of technical information, swatches and tools designed to help you get what you need when you need it. The site includes a dedicated Painter & Decorator section with links to all the info you need to get the best out of the site. Whether you are looking for swatches, case studies, data sheets or the entire Spec Manual, it's all sitting there waiting for you.

Probably the most important feature of the site is the Search function on the front page. If you are looking for info and don't know where on earth to start, type it into the Search box and it will bring up all the topics that include that keyword. You can then select the topics that interest you and read and print as you wish.

There are a number of very handy tools for professional painters, so here's a small taste of the free stuff you can get your hands on at www.resene.co.nz.

#### **COLOUR QUICK CHECK**

Looking for a Resene colour and don't know where to start to find it? Jump online and go to the **virtual colour library** at www.resene.co.nz/swatches/index.htm - type in the colour name you are looking for and the software will bring up all the swatches that meet your description.



Click on one to get a closer look and to find out more info on the colour - such as what chart/s it is on, recommended complementary colours to get you started on a colour scheme and reflectance values, always important with exterior plaster finishes, Harditex and the like.

PLUS it'll even tell you what tone the colour is tinted from so when you are quoting for a job, you can check the colours before you start to make sure you are charging the right price.

#### **THE REAL THING**

If you are not planning a trip to your local ColorShop for a few days but need to get your hands on a Resene colour chart, order it online from our **Order Colour Charts** section at www.resene.co.nz/com/services/archserv.htm and



we'll post out your request to you FREE! Just a few mouse clicks and less than a minute later, your order will be placed and you can get on with other work.

#### **SPEC TIME**

Need to figure out a spec for your next job? Type in: ezyspec.resene.co.nzlindex2.html - to access Resene EzySpec - Resene's electronic specification software. Simply answer questions about your project, such as substrate, interior/exterior exposure, etc and EzySpec will search its database

to give you the best system to match your project requirements. Once you have done your spec, click on the product names and print out data sheets, then click again to view MSDS and print them if you wish. Easy.

Resene EzySpec is a handy little tool whether you want to write a full spec or just check out the best system for a job. You'll impress clients when you present them with a printed page of the system you are recommending and copies of the product data sheets with your quote. Best of all, this extra service will only take you 2-3 minutes to do.







#### WHERE ELSE?

Planning to use a product you have never used before and wanting to get an idea of what it has been used for before (or perhaps reassure clients that it is fit for purpose)? Click your way to the **Products in Action** section at www.resene.co.nz/archspec/

products/index.htm. This section contains over 200 project stories drawn from the Resene News over the last few years. To find projects using the product you plan to use, type in the product name in the Search box and wait for the projects to pop up, then click on those that interest you and print out copies as you need to.

Each story is accompanied by a picture of the building, so if it is in an area near you, you may

even be able to see it for yourself. The project stories include information about a huge range of Resene products from Tennis Court Coating to Wintergrade Lumbersider to Sandtex and through to the main shelfline products such as Lumbersider.

#### **SEE THE FINISH**




If virtual painting is a little too techo for you and you are working on a large development, you may find the **Resene RenderRite service** is just the ticket. Resene RenderRite will virtually paint your picture for you, provided your project meets the volume requirements, or if you still want to virtually paint your picture using EzyPaint but can't find the time to path it they can do the pathing part for you and email you the files so that

you can spend all your time painting. If you need more info on this free service, check out the RenderRite brochure or ask your rep.

#### **PAPER WARS**

The **Professional Painter section** also includes copies of the Painter Stationery we have created... you can download the invoice forms, quote forms and the colour scheme forms and complete them electronically. Of course if you prefer the paper version just ask your rep for your free copies.



You don't need to be a computer whiz kid or even own a computer to make the most of the online services. Use your own computer or check out your local internet café, surf around for 30 minutes and you will spot all these services plus lots of other info that is bound to come in handy.

### **New Products**

#### **Size** Matters

Over the next few months you'll see some new pack sizes joining the shelves - look out for **Zylone SpaceCote** and **Lumbersider white 500ml**, **Broadwall Acrylic Wallboard Sealer 1L** and **Kwila Decking Stain 1L**. These smaller pack sizes will help you to buy just what you need for the job, rather than being left with lots of extra paint.

#### Off Yellow

To make life easier, Hi-Op Yellow and Yellow 1 tones will be phased out over the next few months and will be replaced with **Yellow 2 tone** instead. Apart from the obvious benefits of having half the number of packs on shelf, it will be easier to keep a single yellow tone in stock and once the phase in period is complete we should be able to introduce Yellow 2 tone to new products allowing you to purchase colours from yellow tones in a wider variety of paints. It'll be a little messy for a few months while we change between the yellow tones, but it'll all be worth it when we have the new tone available in all stores.

As with any other product change, we recommend you use the same product for the whole job - therefore if you start a job using a Hi-Op Yellow tinted colour you should continue to use that for the rest of the job rather than switching to a Yellow 2 tinted colour.
