- Clean wate
- Craft knif
- Hammer
- Mineral turpentine

 exterior and unpainted

- Resene Lumbersider

- Resene Moss & Mould Killer




To get the look:

STEP ONE

Remove the old doors and hinges from the shed.

STEP TWO

Remove any builders' paper from the walls with a craft knife and cut out two openings on either side wall of the shed, cutting between vertical supports, as shown.

STEP THREE

Fix the sections of trellis into each of the openings using 20mm clouts.

STEP FOUR

Mix one part Resene Moss & Mould Killer to five parts clean water.

STEP FIVE

Brush the solution onto the exterior painted surfaces of the shed and leave for 48 hours.

STEP SIX

Mix one part Resene Paint Prep and Housewash to three parts clean water.

STEP SEVEN

Scrub the solution onto the exterior painted surfaces of the shed and rinse off with clean water. Allow to dry.


















STEP EIGHT

Apply two coats of Resene Unwind to the roof and door surrounds, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.

STEP NINE

Apply two coats of Resene Alabaster to the exterior walls, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.

STEP TEN

Apply one coat of Resene Wood Primer to the interior cedar walls and allow to dry. Clean brush in mineral turpentine.

STEP ELEVEN

Prime the trellis with Resene Quick Dry and allow to dry.

STEP TWELVE

Prime the floor with Resene Quick Dry and allow to dry.

STEP THIRTEEN

Paint the trellis with two coats of Resene Alabaster, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.

STEP FOURTEEN

Paint the interior walls with two coats of Resene Alabaster, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.

STEP FIFTEEN

Paint the floor with two coats of Resene Walk-on in Resene Inside Back, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.

Handy tip:

If you have opening windows and doors, use Resene Lustacryl vaterborne enamel instead of Resene Lumbersider so doors and windows open and close without sticking.
