

## **Rocking chair**



**→ Difficulty level** ★easy ★★moderate ★★★challenging

Fun with furniture with Mark Rayner - 20

## You will need:

- Clean cloths
- Paintbrushes (including a medium artists' brush)
- Resene Lustacryl tinted to **Resene Quarter Tea**
- Resene Waterborne Smooth **Surface Sealer**
- Sandpaper
- Wooden rocking chair (ours was previously varnished)



Step one

Remove any dust and dirt from the rocking chair with a damp cloth and allow to dry.



Step two

Lightly sand the old varnish of the rocking chair to provide a 'key'.



Step three

Wipe off any sanding dust with a clean cloth.



Step four

Turn the rocking chair on its side and apply one coat of Resene Smooth Surface sealer to the legs, rockers and underside.



To get the look:

painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Flat tinted to Resene Envy.

Step five

Stand the chair the right way up and continue to apply one coat of Resene Smooth Surface sealer to the back, arms and seat. Allow two hours to dry.



Step six

Use a medium artists' brush to work Resene Quarter Tea into any of the smaller carved areas on the back of the chair.



Step seven

Apply one coat of Resene Quarter Tea to the legs, rockers and underside of the rocking chair.



## Step eight

Apply one coat of Resene Quarter Tea to the back, arms and seat of the rocking chair. Allow two hours to dry and apply a second coat of Resene Quarter Tea to the entire chair. Leave two hours to dry.



For a brilliant bright red effect use Resene Lustacryl tinted Resene Guardsman Red.
