- Clean cloth
- . Mineral turps for washing brushes
- Old wooden side table
- Paintbrushes
- Resene Oristal Clear polyurethane
- Resene Danska Teak Oil
- Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Code Red, or use Resene Enamacryl for a waterborne enamel finish
- Resene Wood Primer
- Sandpaper



Step oneRemove the old plastic covering from the table



Step twoSand the entire table, ensuring any old varnish is completely removed.



Step threeWipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



Step fourApply one coat of Resene Wood Primer to all parts of the table excluding the top. Allow to dry.



Step five

Apply one coat of Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Code Red to all parts of the table excluding the top. Allow to dry.



Step six

Apply a second coat of Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Code Red and allow to dry.



Step seven

Apply one coat of Resene Danska Teak Oil to the table top and allow to dry.



Step eight

Apply three coats of Resene Oristal Clear polyurethane to the table top ensuring each coat is dry before applying the
