## You will need:

- Clean cloth
- Garden chair
- Mineral turps for cleaning brushes
- Paint stirrer
- Paintbrushes

- Resene GP Metal Primer
- Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Adrenalin
- Resene Wood Primer
- Sandpaper



Step 1
Sand any areas of rust from the metal frame and then wipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



**Step 2**Carefully stir the Resene
GP Metal Primer.



Step 3
Apply one coat of Resene
GP Metal Primer to the
metal frame and allow
to dry. Clean brush with
mineral turps.



**Step 4**Carefully stir the Resene Wood Primer.



**Step 5**Apply one coat of Resene Wood Primer to the wooden slats and allow to dry. Clean brush with mineral turps.



Step 6
Carefully stir the Resene
Super Gloss tinted to
Resene Adrenalin.



**Step 7**Apply one coat of Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Adrenalin to the chair and allow to dry.



Apply a second coat of Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Adrenalin to the chair and allow to dry. Clean brush with mineral turps. Or, for a waterborne finish, replace Resene Super Gloss with Resene Enamacryl.

Go bold and brighten up an old garden chair using a fabulous Resene orange.



To get the look:

Mark painted the background corrugated iron fence with Resene Enamacryl tinted to Resene Sponge.
