The Resene woodcare range of wood stains, including Resene Woodsman for outdoor timber and Resene Colorwood for interiors, protects timber while also retaining and enhancing the natural beauty of wood. Non film-forming wood stains soak into the timber rather than coating the surface like paint, highlighting the beautiful grains of wood and retaining the fibrous texture.

Wooden cladding on exteriors and interiors gives homes character and reminds us of our connection to the natural world. As our lives become busier and increasingly digitised, it's no wonder we crave the calming qualities of the outdoors. For this reason, wood has been popular in architecture and interior design. But even nature needs a helping hand. Wood is prone to UV damage, particularly in Australia and New Zealand; our clear skies and temperate weather cycles means it needs extra care. Protecting timber with wood stains from the Resene Woodsman and Resene Colorwood range helps timber to keep looking its best and allows for it to be rejuvenated and refreshed later.

The white walls in Resene Black White and vanity doors in Resene Black Sheep (try Resene Grey Friars) continue the spa-inspired style.

- 3. Preventing damage from mould, fungi and bacteria.

Wood is not only beautiful, but ethically harvested timber is considered a very sustainable building material. Wood is a renewable resource, and during the growing process, trees capture carbon dioxide from the environment in a process called carbon sequestration. Timber is a durable and adaptable building material that, if protected correctly, has a long lifespan. Resene's range of woodcare products, including Resene Woodsman for outdoor timber and Resene Colorwood for interiors, includes many Environmental Choice-approved options with low volatile organic compounds (VOC).





Timber cladding brings with it grains, knots, colour and texture of wood – these minute variations make a beautiful building material. Even the most modern, sleek architectural designs feel softened and comforting when built with timber. Resene Woodsman wood stains let the timber be the star of the design by accentuating its natural beauty and protecting it from the elements

The home is exposed to the elements and the Resene Waterborne Woodsman CoolColour formula was chosen to make sure the stain reflects heat and to help protect the timber.





- Resene Waterborne Woodsman is a penetrating stain for weatherboards and fences, available in a range of colours.
- Resene Woodsman Decking Oil Stain is a waterborne penetrating stain for decks, available in a range of colours.
- Resene Woodsman wood oil stain is ideal for those who prefer a more traditional wood oil style finish.
- Resene Kwila Timber Stain is designed for kwila and other exotic hardwoods and is very popular on decking, furniture and garage doors.
- Resene Furniture and Decking Oil is a lightly coloured oil ideal for decks and furniture.
- Resene Timber and Furniture Gel is much like a furniture polish, but for outside projects, this is a thicker product that can be applied to a variety of small timber projects and is easier to apply than a standard stain.
- Resene Timber and Deck Wash is ideal for cleaning down timber surfaces before you paint or stain. While waterblasting can seem like a quick way to clean, not only is it likely to be less effective than scrubbing using Resene Timber and Deck Wash, it can gouge and badly damage the timber.
- Resene Deep Clean will work with the weather to help keep your exterior surfaces cleaner. Once your decorating is done, simply spray or brush on Resene Deep Clean every 6-12 months on paths, patios, decks and other exterior cementitious, timber and painted surfaces.

stain and able

Resene Woodsman wood stains are designed for exterior timber. Resene Woodsman not only colours timber but weatherproofs it, protects it from UV damage and kills fungi and mould, prolonging the lifespan of the wood. Stains are semi-transparent and penetrating, meaning the colour is absorbed into the timber to allow the wood's natural grain to show through.

how to choose a stain

As timber comes in various colours, densities, textures and weathers in different ways, the colour of your

stain will vary depending on your type of timber. Stain applied to light woods such as Siberian larch will appear much stronger and brighter in colour than the same stain applied to darker wood such as cedar. Use an offcut of the cladding to test the colour of the stain before you start the job. Some woods may need multiple coats of stain to reach the desired colour.

If planning a new build with exterior timber cladding, consider access and maintenance. Wood stains need to be reapplied every couple of years, so if stains are applied at a height that requires scaffolding, this adds significant hassle and cost to reapplication.

Most wood stains require maintenance every 2-3 summers and wood oils, often annually.

did you know?

Resene Woodsman comes in a CoolColour variant, which reflects more heat, keeping the stain and surface cooler in the hot summer. Resene CoolColour also reduces the incidence of cupping and warping. Dark colours are not suitable for all surfaces, so check with your Resene ColorShop team whether a dark colour and a Resene CoolColour are right for your project.

which product?

Resene Waterborne Woodsman

This penetrating oil stain is absorbed into the timber, colouring the wood and allowing the grain and natural beauty of the wood to show through. Resene Waterborne Woodsman is available in a wide range of colours, including black, bright and limed colours and in Resene CoolColour variants, to allow greater design freedom and creativity. This Environmental Choice approved product contains fungicides to help prevent damage from mould and also helps protect against UV light.

It's suitable for use on a wide range of exterior timber surfaces, including weatherboards, dressed and rough sawn timber, fences, beams and plywood. It is also tolerant of poorly prepared and weathered timber, making it an excellent choice for older cedar.

Resene Woodsman (traditional oil-based) wood oil stain

This solventborne traditional penetrating oil stain gives a natural look to timber. It absorbs well into exterior timber surfaces such as weatherboards, decking and furniture. It is very suitable for rough sawn timber on weatherboards and fences and on decking as an alternative to Resene Woodsman Decking Oil Stain or Resene Furniture and Decking Oil. Resene Woodsman is often used on more weathered surfaces as the solventborne stain can penetrate better.

waterborne vs solventborne?

Waterborne stains and clears can be thinned and cleaned up with water when wet and have a faster drying time. They are low odour and lower in VOC (volatile organic compounds) than solventborne stains. Waterborne stains are, in most cases, more durable.

Solventborne stains tend to give a more natural look when first applied, but they must be cleaned up with other solvents, such as turps. They are high in VOCs and higher in odour. They usually penetrate deeper than waterborne stains and are more tolerant of adverse weather conditions (e.g. humidity) while drying.

top tip

Resene Woodsman Pitch Black

Tannin staining from timber is a brownish or tan discolouration of waterborne wood stains that can occur when the stain is applied over bare wood. Staining commonly occurs when water soluble tannins found in wood, particularly cedar, redwood, kwila and beech, seep through a waterborne stain and discolour it. Although the discolouration may bleach out in open, exposed areas, it can be persistent in damp areas that receive little sunlight. If tannin staining is likely, use a solventborne stain like Resene Woodsman wood oil stain.

top tip If you're staining an already stained area, the old stain colour will affect the look of the new stain colour. Always try a sample or do a test patch when changing the stain colour.

choosing a

know your timber

Before you start, ensure you know the type of timber and its natural colour. The same colour stain can look remarkably different on different types of wood. Hardwoods and high-density timbers do not absorb stain as readily as softer timbers. You may need to select a darker stain or apply an extra coat to get your desired colour. View samples of stained timber at your Resene ColorShop and make sure you use a Resene testpot to test the colour on a timber offcut. If no offcut is available, find a discreet part of the timber to test it on.

colours to try

- Black Sleek and modern, dark brown and black wood stains amp up the drama. Resene Woodsman shows the texture and grain of the timber giving the overall appearance a softer quality than black paint. Try Resene Pitch Black, a tar creosote black, Resene Charred Black, a modern black, Resene Shadow Match, a black with a shadow of brown or Resene Crowshead, a tar brown that looks great in a country setting.
 - Red Red wood stains are bold and architectural while also quite at home in a natural setting. Try Resene Japanese Maple, a bright and elegant hue inspired by autumn foliage or Resene Whero, an earthy red which gives modern flair to timber extensions on older brick buildings.



did you know?

The light reflectance value – LRV – for a colour tells you the proportion of light that a surface reflects compared to the amount of light that falls on that surface. Wood stains do not usually have light reflectance values, because the timber underneath the stain affects the colour. A stain on light coloured timber will have a higher LRV – i.e. will reflect more light, than the same stain on a darker timber. Some councils will require specific LRVs for exterior colours. This may mean you need to choose a painted finish unless the council agrees to a stain equivalent.

top tip

Avoid clear coatings for exterior timber. Using clear coatings on exterior timber is like using coconut oil as a sunblock on bare skin. Clear finishes allow all the damaging UV light from the sun to reach the timber and over time the timber will be seriously degraded and the surface will come apart like loose straw. If you want to achieve a natural look finish and protect the timber, choose a Resene Woodsman wood stain as close as possible to the wood's natural colour.

- Grey Turn your home into a silver fox by combining popular grey colours that nod to weathered, aged timber – if only we could all age so gracefully. Try Resene Tiri, a dark grey suited to contemporary homes or Resene Smokey Ash which gives a weathered timber look with a hint of smoke
- **Sublime limed** Go pale and interesting with a whitewashed limed timber look (for much less fuss than actual liming). Try Resene Limed Oak for a mellow, warm brown, Resene Limed Ash, a soft grey ash colour or Resene Limed Gum, a subtle gumtree brown.
- Nearly nude Give nature a little helping hand while letting the natural colours of the timber shine through. Resene Woodsman Natural adds a slight tint to timber to enhance the appearance. Other barely-there colours to try include Resene Woodsman Uluru and Resene Woodsman Driftwood. If you'd like a natural look on exterior timber, opt for a Resene wood stain colour as close as possible to the timber colour.
- Cedar Resene Oiled Cedar creates the ultimate cedar look to enhance this popular timber and allows the beautiful grain to show through. For a similar solid paint colour on spouting and trims, try Resene Hukanui
- Whitewash For a white-hot exterior, try finishing pale and blonde timber with Resene Woodsman Whitewash for a modern Scandi look. Whitewash can be tinted to greywash options for a dusty silver look.

need to know

Resene does not recommend clear stains or varnishes on exterior timber as they do not provide sufficient protection for the timber against the weather or UV damage. Light will pass through them and damage the timber underneath, which will usually lead to the clear finishes flaking off.

application tips

- Apply Resene Woodsman with a brush to ensure the stain penetrates into the timber.
- The first coat over bare timber should aim to saturate the wood so that the surface is totally wetted with the stain
- Apply along the grain of the timber and take care to always keep a good 'wet edge' by ensuring that the last stroke of stain doesn't dry before the next stroke is applied. Maintaining the wet edge allows the new brush-load to be merged in evenly. Work across 1 or 2 weatherboards or floorboards at a time at a good pace rather than trying to do an area too wide. Lap marks are more likely to occur when painting in hot weather and/ or when painting very dry weathered timber.
- Avoid applying stain in direct, strong sunshine.
- The second coat of stain will be easier to apply than the first coat and will spread easily. Be careful not to apply excess stain as this might give the surface a splotchy appearance.

- which are harder for wood stains to penetrate. If possible, apply a third coat of stain to timber with latewood grains after three to six months.
- Depending on the colour, stains may need maintenance after two summers but you may find on the protected side of the house and after future maintenance cycles, because of stain build-up in the timber, you can go longer before you need to restain.
- Darker stains will soak in more light and heat and the timber will heat up faster. Resene CoolColour technology is designed to reflect more of the sun's energy than standard colours, helping to reduce heat build-up and reduce the incidence of cupping and warping.
- Exterior stains will usually penetrate better on rough-sawn timber than dressed timber. Better results will also be obtained over quarter-sawn timber compared to flat sawn. This is because more stain will soak into rough sawn and quarter sawn wood.

- Aim to put on the right amount not too much and not too little. As a wood stain penetrates into the surface, the finish will appear low sheen or matte in finish. If you apply too much, a stain finish can look glossy. Applying too little also causes problems. Reducing the strength of an exterior stain colour by thinning it or overspreading it means less protection for the timber. The more timber grain you can see, usually the shorter the time to next maintenance. This is particularly true on smooth sawn or dressed timber.
- Where walls are partially protected from the sun by overhanging soffits uneven weathering of stains will occur. There is nothing that can be done about this but to be aware that this will happen and that special care is needed during maintenance to ensure an even colour from top to bottom
- Unlike a paint, the spreading rate for a penetrating stain can vary dramatically. Rough timbers usually require more stain than smooth timbers. Very old, weathered timber can be very dry and can soak in much more stain than you expect. Hard timbers may soak in a lot less. Usually the first coat will take a lot more stain than any subsequent coats. Generally it pays to buy a little extra, which you can use for touch-ups or maintenance. Avoid applying too much stain.
- When applying a waterborne varnish, it is possible that the water in the coating can 'raise the grain' of the wood, resulting in some

- degree of roughness. This is especially so with certain hardwood species such as oak and walnut. To avoid this roughening effect, predampen the wood surface with a wet rag and allow it to dry for a half-hour. Carefully sand the surface in the direction of the wood grain with fine-grit sandpaper to remove any wood 'whiskers' that may appear. Dust off the surface before applying the clear finish.
- Mineral wood oils, such as Wood-X, are often factory applied to timber, such as new cedar. A timber finished in mineral wood oil must continue to be finished in mineral wood oil. If stained or painted, the mineral wood oil is likely to cause the paint or stain to fail. Mineral wood oils often look like stains.







A good deck can transform your home. Bridging outdoors and indoors, decks expand your living areas and offer outdoor dining spaces for barbecues or long lazy weekend lunches. As an extension of your exterior, decks can tie your home into the landscape and add to your home's street appeal. Wood stains and oils bring out the natural beauty of timber decking to either help blend into the natural environment or create the 'wow factor' on your exterior. Staining your deck will also protect it from wind, rain and UV damage, so your deck not only looks beautiful but is less prone to drying out, splitting and splinters.

the three steps to protecting your deck:

- 1. wash
- 2. stain or oil
- 3. enjoy!

Refreshing your deck is one of the most straightforward DIY jobs you can do in a weekend. From natural decking oils to coloured stains, the product you choose depends on the type of timber, the condition of the wood and your desired look.

what product to choose

Pine, macrocarpa, cedar and other treated softwoods

Resene Furniture and Decking Oil

This resin and wax blend gives a natural look which brings out the beauty of the timber - like polishing a wooden table or shining your shoes. Resene Furniture and Decking Oil protects the timber from water, fungi and UV damage. It is guick and easy to apply and designed for annual application.

• Resene Woodsman Decking Oil Stain

This hybrid waterborne alkyd stain is designed especially for pine, macrocarpa and other treated softwood decks. It has fewer fumes and VOCs (volatile organic compounds) than traditional solventborne stains and is available in a wide range of colours including natural (see colour chart on page 51). Many colours are available in Resene CoolColour versions which are ideal for dark coloured decks to keep them cooler over summer.

Kwila

Kwila is a hardwood often found in decks. This timber native to South East Asia has a natural red colour which can leach and bleed from the wood. To refresh its natural colour, use Resene Kwila Timber Stain, this product can also be used on other exotic hardwoods. To change the colour of kwila apply Resene Woodsman in the desired tint, or for an oiled look apply Resene Furniture and Decking Oil.

Timberland did you know? Before using a new deck, ensure there is at least one coat of stain or paint to protect it from damage. Bare timber may be permanently damaged and stained by furniture, shoes or dropped food.

did you know?

If your stairs and pathways are slippery when wet, apply Resene Non-Skid Deck & Path. This textured waterborne finish has a gritty texture which makes it easier to grip on to, reducing the chances of slipping. Resene Non-Skid Deck & Path may be tinted to suit the colour of your deck. It's a good idea to apply this to the edge of stairs and decking in a contrasting colour to your decking stain, then apply your wood stain up to the edge of the non-skid finish. Stains cannot be made into non-skid finishes with the addition of grit. This is because the stain will penetrate into the surface and will not hold onto the grit.

choosing a colour

There are a few things to consider when choosing a colour for your deck:

Your home's exterior: Consider if you want to match the colour of the exterior or finish in a contrasting colour to make it a feature of your home.

Indoor-outdoor flow: If your home has timber flooring, you might want to consider matching the deck's colour to the colour of the interior flooring to create seamless flow between the outdoor and indoor living areas.

Wear and tear: Decks are usually high traffic areas and can take quite a beating. Choose a practical colour that can be easily kept clean. Too light or too dark will tend to show up muddy shoe marks.

The natural surroundings:

If your deck has a coastal view, you might want to consider a sandy natural tone. If your home is surrounded by bush, try a deep green such as Resene Evergreen or a rich brown such as Resene Dark Oak.

prep work

Greying and weathered decks: Before staining, treat any moss and mould with Resene Moss & Mould Killer before cleaning with Resene Timber and Deck Wash. This will prevent any algae or

Once your staining is done, apply Resene Deep Clean every 6-12 months to keep it looking good. Simply spray or brush on and leave Resene Deep Clean and the weather to clean off moss, algae and the like. Ideal for use on paths, patios, decks and other exterior timber, concrete and painted surfaces. You can also use it on the canvas of outdoor furniture – try a test area out first on an inconspicuous area.

moss growing through and discolouring the stain and give you a cleaner surface to work with. Remember that stains and marks will show through your stain so the cleaner the timber before you stain the better the finished result.

New decks: If timing allows, let the timber weather for at least four to five weeks before washing with Resene Timber and Deck Wash. As new timber is quite dense, it can be harder for it to absorb the colour. Washing the timber agitates and opens up the wood particles to allow it to better soak up and absorb the wood stain or oil. This helps to open up the timber surface and remove tannins







how to wash and stain a timber deck

- Treat mould with Resene Moss & Mould Killer. Apply then leave overnight, scrub and rinse off. After the mould is treated, apply Resene Timber and Deck Wash to your deck using a garden sprayer.
- 2. Scrub the Resene Timber and Deck Wash using a short-bristled, long-handled scrubbing brush to remove any dirt and debris before rinsing with fresh water.

 Top tip: Work in small sections to prevent the product from drying before it is rinsed.
- 3. Allow the deck to dry before applying your chosen Resene wood stain. We used Resene Woodsman Decking Oil Stain

- tinted to Resene Tamarind. First apply the stain by cutting in any edges or hard to reach areas of the deck using a brush.
- 4. Working in a planned route (so you aren't walking over your stain), apply Resene Woodsman Decking Oil Stain to the flat surfaces of the deck using a Deckmaster Brush or lambswool applicator pad. Lay off in a uniform direction down the length of the boards
- 5. Allow to dry for at least two hours. If a second coat is required, work in the same direction as the first coat.

Staining a fence with Resene wood stains gives your whole home and garden a lift. A fence not only creates privacy and keeps pets in bounds but gives a property a sense of space with a clearly defined border. why wood stain?

Resene Waterborne Woodsman is a quick, easy fence staining option with very little preparation required. It's available in a wide range of colours, including CoolColours which reflect more heat – your plants will thank you for it. Resene Waterborne Woodsman is designed to be reapplied every couple of years, and although a paint such as Resene Lumbersider will last longer, there are some advantages to choosing a wood stain. While you need to maintain wood stains more regularly, often all that is needed is a quick wash then you can apply the stain. If fences are painted and left too long before maintenance, the paint may start peeling, which will need to be sanded back – a much bigger job!

fence colours

 Dark brown and black - Dark fences give a modern look and are an excellent option for establishing border gardens. Dark fences give gardens the illusion of depth and appear lusher - and blacks and browns contrast nicely with bright greens making your plants stand out. Try Resene Crowshead, Resene Charred Black and Resene Pitch Black. Be wary; while black fences look great when bordered with plants, they can look quite intimidating from the street so be considerate of height.

- Green A green fence is a gardener's best friend, helping plants blend into the border and adding colour to the backyard even in the height of winter. Try Resene Earthsong, Resene Canopy and Resene Rangitoto.
- Warm browns Warm browns help your fence blend into the landscape while bringing warmth in colder months. Try Resene Iroko or Resene Timberland.

Old, weathered timber is often very dry and can soak in much more stain than new timber. It pays to buy a little more than you'd expect to use to ensure you don't run out. The first coat of stain will be absorbed more into the timber than subsequent coats, so you will usually find you use less stain on the second coat

top tip

stain your fence in four easy steps:

- To prepare your fence for staining, treat any moss or algae using Resene Moss & Mould Killer.
- 2. Wash the fence with Resene Timber and Deck Wash making sure to scrub well, following the instructions on the pack. Rinse well and allow to dry.
- 3. Apply the first coat of Resene Waterborne Woodsman (we used Resene Warm Kwila) using a large brush working from top to bottom on each paling. Allow to dry for 24 hours before applying a second coat.
- If needed, use a cutting in brush to cut in between the palings and for details such as trellis.

This non-drip gel formula is ideal for coating furniture such as chairs and tables as it won't drip through cracks like a regular wood stain. It is available in a range of colours so your furniture finish can complement or contrast with your home's weatherboard or decking wood stain colour. You can also use Resene Woodsman wood oil stain or Resene Furniture and Decking Oil for furniture.

If you're staining new kwila timber remember the kwila colour can leech out. Place the furniture somewhere that won't be affected by staining and wait until the leeching out is complete before placing it on your deck.

rejuvenate weathered garden furniture in 5 easy steps

- Use a garden sprayer to saturate the timber surface of the furniture using Resene Timber and Deck Wash diluted with fresh water following the instructions on the label. Avoid direct sunlight and ensure the surface remains damp for approximately 15 minutes.
- 2. Scrub using a short-bristled scrubbing brush and fresh water to remove mould and dirt. Rinse thoroughly.
- Allow to dry before sanding any 'furred' timber or marks.
- Protect any decking or paving with a dropcloth before applying Resene Timber and Furniture Gel with a brush, taking care not to 'double lap' the stain.
- 5. Allow the stain to penetrate the timber for 4-5 minutes before wiping down the excess stain in a circular motion using a clean lint-free cotton cloth. If necessary apply a thin second coat but allow the stain to penetrate the timber for only 2-3 minutes before wiping down.

top tip

When staining new outdoor furniture, if possible allow the furniture to weather for 4-5 weeks and clean with Resene Timber and Deck Wash before staining to help open up the timber to accept the stain.



Resene Colorwood

This waterborne penetrating wood stain is formulated for interior timber and can be used to enhance timber and composite boards, including Strandboard, plywood, MDF and most flooring. It's available in a range of natural shades as well as vibrant colours, is low odour and can be easily applied with a brush with the excess wiped off with a cloth. Resene Colorwood is usually overcoated with Resene Aquaclear, Resene Qristal Clear polyurethane or Resene Oristal ClearFloor.

Rough sawn interior timber, such as beams, may be stained with Resene Colorwood without clear finishing or polyurethaning.

a winning combination

Many people ask why it's best to apply a basecoat of Resene Colorwood before applying a clear topcoat, even when opting for a natural look. Even though clear topcoats will protect timber because of their clear nature, they will always let light pass through and cannot prevent UV light from attacking the surface of the wood. The tinter in Resene Colorwood helps to block some of the UV light to provide more protection than a clear finish.

The final colour will depend on the stain colour chosen, the type of wood being stained, and the number of coats applied. Dark and hardwoods absorb less stain, so several coats may need to be applied, whereas light-coloured timber or plywood will make the same stain look stronger. Use a small amount of Resene Colorwood to try the colour out before starting on your project. Resene Woodsman exterior colours (see page 51) can also be tinted into Resene Colorwood if you want to bring your exterior wood stain colours into your interior. See the Resene Colorwood colour range on page 54.

• White ideas — Resene Colorwood Whitewash and Resene Colorwood Greywash (available in mid and light strengths) are not absorbed into timber like a stain but enhance the surface with a lightened white or grey look. Apply over uncoated timber or composite boards or over aged, yellowed polyurethanes and varnishes for a contemporary whitewashed look without the need to strip the existing polyurethane coating.

Opposite: To achieve the minimalist look without the starkness of a pure white, try Resene Colorwood Whitewash paired with natural timber furniture. Flooring in Resene Soapstone.



Use these wash hues individually or combine them into a coastal palette. Ideal for baches and cribs or to bring coastal style to any home.

Resene Colorwood can be used on walls and flooring but also on furniture and toys. Two popular traditional stained effects you may wish to try are distressing and two-tone:

distressing

Create a vintage timeworn look on furniture using the distressing technique. Apply Resene Colorwood and allow it to dry completely. Remove the stain from selected areas, usually edges and corners, using p180-p220 grit sandpaper. This allows the wood to show through the colour to simulate wear and tear. Finish by sealing the entire surface with a clear coat, such as Resene Aquaclear.

two-tone effect

Resene Colorwood stains can be layered to produce exciting and unique results much like a colourwash effect. To create this effect, first, apply a base colour of Resene Colorwood stain and wipe off any excess. Immediately feather on a second Resene Colorwood colour and wipe down carefully. Add additional Resene Colorwood colours for a multi-tone

effect. Allow the stain to dry completely, and then apply your clear topcoat. This effect works particularly well with two similar colours. For a more dramatic result, allow the first colour to dry before applying the second colour or distress the stain by sanding lightly along the grain before applying a clear coat. This effect works well on walls and furniture such as headboards

You can also use this technique to replicate a pickling effect - simply apply one of the lighter Resene Colorwood stains such as Resene Natural followed by a coat of Resene Rock Salt. Wipe off the excess stain, leaving touches of the lighter stain behind to soften the base colour. Vary the contrast colours to suit your colour palette.

application tips

• As Resene Colorwood is semi-transparent, any marks and stains on the timber will show through. Sand new wood following the grain

to remove any surface imperfections and wipe clean before applying Resene Colorwood.

- Dampen the surface by spraying a light mist of clean water onto the surface to reduce the absorbency of the board. Add Resene Hot Weather Additive to slow drying if required.
- Plan your staining process. Resene Colorwood should remain wet before wiping off the excess. Allow the product to stay on the surface for approximately five minutes before wiping. Ensure the stain is applied evenly - the longer the stain is left on the surface, the deeper the colour will be. Take care to avoid lap marks as these will make your finish look uneven.
- Wipe the surface using a clean cloth to remove excess stain and have extra cloths handy to replace saturated cloths.
- Leave Resene Colorwood to dry before overcoating with a clear Resene finish. Interior stains left uncoated have no resistance to marks. such as watermarks or coffee cup stains.

which gloss level should I choose?

- Gloss Gloss finishes make a surface appear cleaner and brighter but because they are highly reflective, they can highlight imperfections. They are easy to clean and are ideal for heavy wear areas such as doors, joinery and flooring. Try Resene Qristal Poly-Gloss or Resene Aquaclear gloss.
- Semi-gloss A semi-gloss has a slightly reflective appearance but is more forgiving of imperfections than a gloss clear finish. It is ideal for walls and woodwork which receive a lot of wear and tear. Try Resene Aquaclear semi-gloss.
- Satin/low sheen Satin and low sheen finishes are popular for walls and ceilings. Their lower sheen diffuses light and helps to conceal surface imperfections. Colours underneath satin/low sheen clear finishes appear muddied and darker than when overcoated with a glossier finish. Try Resene Aquaclear satin or Resene Qristal Clear Poly-Satin.
- Flat/matte Matte finishes diffuse the light and impart a very natural look to the surface but are not as durable as high gloss finishes. They are usually best used on walls and ceilings. Try Resene Aquaclear Natural or Resene Qristal Poly-Flat.

If you have used Resene Colorwood, the clear finish you choose will change how the colour looks. A clear gloss urethane, such as Resene Aquaclear, will make the colour appear more vibrant than a clear flat polyurethane, such as Resene Aquaclear Natural.

waterborne or solventborne

For interior projects we recommend using waterborne products wherever possible as they are lower odour and easier to clean up with water. Solventborne products tend to yellow as they age which can suit some timbers.

most home decorators choose:

- Waterborne Resene Aquaclear for walls, ceilings, furniture, doors and trim. This waterborne varnish has fewer VOCs than solventborne products. It will appear milky in the can but dries to a clear finish. This non-yellowing formula is more suited to white (or pale) timbers such as pine, macrocarpa and oak as well as composite boards, MDF and particle and strand board.
- Waterborne Resene Qristal ClearFloor 1K for flooring. It's lower odour and has fewer VOCs than traditional solventborne flooring finishes.
- Solventborne Resene Qristal Clear polyurethane for good all-round durability and furniture, joinery and panelling in wet areas. It gives a yellow tone to timber and is best suited to timbers with a yellow, orange or red undertone such as cedar, rimu, kauri, eucalyptus and jarrah.



safety tip

Rags or papers soaked with oil-based paints or varnishes can catch fire through spontaneous combustion. After use allow them to dry out and air flat in open areas away from combustible materials rather than crumpled up. Or immerse rags etc. in water and then put them in a sealed container. Not all products are prone to spontaneous combustion but it pays to be cautious.

tips for using interior clear finishes

- Sand new timber to remove any surface imperfections. As Resene Colorwood is transparent any residual marks or blemishes on the surface will be apparent in the finished job. Remember to always sand with the grain of the timber.
- Pay special attention to creating a dust free area. A thorough dust and vacuum will help greatly. Be careful not to use old brushes or rollers with dried out paint embedded in the bristles.
- As a final surface preparation step wipe down bare timber or old varnish with a tack-rag.
- Stir the clear gently with a broad knife or clean stirrer. Avoid shaking clear finishes as this may entrain air.
- Satin or matt finish clear coatings contain flatting pigments and the contents are more likely to settle, stir regularly during the application period.
- Use smooth even brushstrokes.
- For mātai or tōtara timber the antioxidants in the timber may prevent Resene Qristal products from drying. Seal with Resene Aquaclear.
- Old varnishes will be very difficult to get adhesion to. Very thorough sanding is required.











timber

and colour combos

Some colours are better suited to the natural look of timber, enhancing and complementing the appearance. When matching your paint to stained or varnished timber consider the undertone and texture of the timber as well as the sheen and reflectiveness of the clear coat. As a general rule, off whites, creams and green white paint colours look handsome paired with timber.

colour guides for common timbers

Rimu

Rimu is very common in heritage homes used on flooring, panelling, furniture and kitchen cabinetry. There are two kinds of rimu; ordinary which is yellow/green in tone and heart rich ginger/gold. Try this yellow wood with creams such as Resene Pearl Lusta, Resene Double Spanish White and greens such as Resene Haven and Resene Aspiring.

Mātai

This warm red/gold-coloured timber was used in many older homes built early last century for flooring, panelled walls or planked ceilings. It goes well with rich warm creams such as Resene Sour Dough, Resene Canterbury Clay, indulgent ochre tans like Resene Mai Tai and blue based greens like Resene Deep Teal and Resene Tangaroa.

Radiata pine

This yellow/white timber prefers clear off whites such as Resene Rice Cake and Resene Green White, dense yellow based greys like Resene Nomad and bolder colours like Resene Pohutukawa, Resene Kaitoke Green and Resene Bunting.

Cedar

Though it has a lovely warm red-brown colour when new it greys off rapidly when exposed to sunlight and weathering. It likes rich warm neutrals such as Resene Spanish White, Resene Double Biscotti and dense greens like Resene Gondwana.

Tawa

Tawa was used a lot during the 1970s for flooring and more recently for kitchen cabinetry. It is a light yellow/beige and takes on a pale honey gold look when polyurethaned with solventborne finishes. Try it with slightly green edged creams like Resene Villa White and Resene Thorndon Cream. Because of its lightness it suits deep blues, greens and charcoals like Resene Indian Ink, Resene Bondi Blue, Resene Bingo and Resene Foundry.

Oak

Oak is often stained a dark colour for traditional furniture trims and panelling in older homes or is varnished as blonde oak. It has strong open graining and when stripped back to bare wood, bleached or whitewashed it takes on a Scandinavian, coastal and shabby chic look. When left as a dark strong colour it likes associating with traditional and earthy colours – Resene Half Dutch White, Resene Jalapeno, Resene Mangrove and Resene Half Pearl Lusta. When stripped it works well with muted greys, blues and greens – Resene Triple Black White, Resene Duck Egg Blue, Resene Half Robin Egg Blue and Resene Periglacial Blue.



most Popular

Common applications for Resene clear coats and varnishes around the home.

- Walls Resene Aquaclear all sheen levels, including Resene Aquaclear Natural or Resene Colorwood Whitewash for a whitewashed look or tinted for a colourwashed look.
- Ceilings Resene Aquaclear all sheen levels, including Resene Aquaclear Natural, most decorators prefer satin or natural to reduce reflection or Resene Colorwood Whitewash for a whitewashed look or tinted for a colourwashed look.
- Furniture Resene Colorwood stain, Resene Aquaclear, Resene Colorwood Whitewash or tinted to a colourwashed look, Resene Qristal Clear Poly-Satin or Poly-Gloss for a solventborne alternative.
- Doors/trim Resene Aquaclear waterborne semi-gloss or satin, or gloss for a higher sheen finish. Or Resene Qristal Poly-Satin or Resene Qristal Poly-Gloss for a solventborne alternative.

top tip

Usually the darker the colour, the longer the maintenance interval will be (how long before it will need to be restained). The effectiveness depends on the depth of colour used, how much is applied and the amount of weathering it receives. Stain colours of the same product type (e.g. two packs of Resene Waterborne Woodsman) may be intermixed, though it can be difficult to replicate an intermixed colour so carefully note the recipe used and mix enough for the full project.





With an adaptable formulation, Resene Waterborne Woodsman is suitable for use on a wide range of exterior timber substrates including weatherboards, dressed and rough sawn timber, fences, beams, plywood and profiled sheets. All exterior wood stain colours shown on this chart (see page 51) are available in Environmental Choice approved Resene Waterborne Woodsman. Colours marked with 'cc' are also available in a Resene CoolColour version.

Resene Woodsman Decking Oil Stain

Tired weathered timber decks can be quickly rejuvenated with Resene Woodsman Decking Stain (see Data Sheet D57D), a waterborne modified oil based stain developed especially for new and weathered decking. Decorators will enjoy the quick and easy water clean up and the absence of the solvent fumes associated with traditional solventborne stains. Colours marked with 'ds' are also available in Resene Woodsman Decking Oil Stain.. Colours marked with 'cc' are also available in a Resene CoolColour version.




